48.01 CONFIRMATION:

The Minutes of the Forty-seventh meeting of the Board of Governors (BoG) of the Institute were confirmed.

48.02 ACTION TAKEN ON DECISIONS OF THE LAST MEETING:

The follow-up action taken on various decisions of the 46th meeting were presented before the Board as under:

47.17 Reorganisation of Departments and Appointment of Heads of Departments:

The Board noted that as per its decision, 3 departments have been merged reducing the total number of academic departments from 20 to 17, and, in 13 of these departments, new HoDs have been appointed, initially for a period of one year with a maximum tenure of three years as per the provisions approved earlier by the Board.

47.19 Maternity Leave:

As desired by the Board, the information on the number of female employees who availed maternity leave during the last three years was presented to the Board. The Board considered the proposal for providing maternity leave of 180 days with full pay to all female employees including even those on contract.

The Board directed that only regular female employees be entitled for 180 days of maternity leave whereas contractual employees shall continue with the provision of 90 days of maternity leave.

47.20 Revised Fee Structure:

The Board noted the revised Fee-structure for BBA, BCA, M.Sc. and Ph.D. Programmes.

47.22 New Courses:

The Board noted the introduction of new full-time UG and PG programmes from the academic session 2013-14 at Mesra and Off-campuses.

47.25 BITOSA Global Centre and Guest House at BIT Premises:

The Board noted that BITOSA Global with the Chairman, BoG, as Patron-in-Chief has been functionalized on 22 March 2014.

47.26 Non-Practicing Allowance(NPA) to Institute Doctors:

The Board noted that a Committee has been constituted to recommend appropriate norms for implementation of NPA for institute doctors in line with provisions in other similar educational institutions and recommendations of the committee were awaited.

47.27 Monthly Allowance to Directors of B I T Off-Campuses:

The Board noted the implementation as approved by the Board w.e.f. 01.11.2013.

47.28 Provision of Additional Increments upon Obtaining Ph.D.:

The Board noted the implementation of the provision for additional increments upon obtaining the Ph.D degree w.e.f. 8th June 2013(the date of the Technical Council meeting in which this was proposed and accepted in the last BoG meeting).

47.31 Centralization of Examinations:

The Board noted the implementation as approved.

47.32 Remuneration for Examination Work:

The Board noted the implementation as approved

47.33 ITI Dighaghat, Patna:

The Board noted that the Government of Bihar (GoB) has been informed about operational difficulties in fulfilling obligations vis-à-vis ITI Dighaghat, as per MoU between B I T and GoB. The need to discontinue this MoU has been communicated to the GoB and their response isawaited.

47.34 Financial Assistance for Foreign Travel under TEQIP II:

The Board noted the implementation as approved.

47.35 Scholarships under TEQIP II:

The Board noted the implementation as approved for ME/MTech students and Ph.D scholars.

48.03 ANNUAL REPORT 2012-2013:

Annual Report for the period 2012-13 was presented to the Board.

The Board approved the 2012-13 Annual Report and directed that in future, the Annual Report and the meeting Agenda be circulated to the members sufficiently in advance.

48.04 ANNUAL ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT REPORT FOR FY 2013-14:

The Annual Accounts and Audit Report for FY 2013-14 were placed before the Board as recommended by the Finance Committee.

These were approved by the Board.

48.05 FINANCE COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FY 2014-15BUDGET ESTIMATES:

The Board considered the recommendations of the Finance Committee and approved the Budget Estimates for FY 2014-15.

48.06 MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS:

The Board noted the appointment of Dr. Arup Roy Choudhury, an alumnus of BIT and the Chairman and Managing Director, NTPC Ltd. by the General Council for membership of the Board of Governors for a period of 3 years w.e.f. 21.04.14. His appointment is in place of Shri G.P. Lal who expired in 2012. The Actg. Registrar was directed to communicate this appointment to Dr. Arup Roy Choudhury.

48.07 NOMINEE OF HINDUSTHAN CHARITY TRUST (HCT) ON THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS:

The Board noted that the HCT has nominated Shri S.N. Agarwal, an alumnus of BIT and the Chairman of Bhoruka Power Corporation, Bengaluru as its nominee on the Board of Governors for a period of 3 years w.e.f. 28.03.2014. His nomination is in place of Dr. H.C. Pande, who completed his term of office in March 2013. The Actg. Registrar was directed to communicate this appointment to Shri S.N. Agarwal.

48.08 XXIV CONVOCATION:

The Board noted that the XXIV Convocation was held on 9th April, 2014. Chancellor of the Institute, the Honourable Governor of Jharkhand, Dr. Syed Ahmed presided and Dr. Arup Roy Choudhury, Chairman and Managing Director, NTPC Ltd. delivered the Convocation Address as Chief Guest.

A total of 3183 students were awarded Degrees and Diplomas in various disciplines. The details were presented to and noted by the Board.

48.09 UGC REGULATION 2010:

It was noted that based on UGC Regulations of 2010, as applicable to Deemed Universities, UGC vide its letter dated December 21, 2011 required BIT to submit its revised MOA and Rules incorporating specific provisions, as contained in the said letter of UGC. The Revised MOA and Rules of BIT were forwarded to UGC vide BIT letter dated August 30, 2012.

In reply, vide letter dated January 1, 2013, UGC required certain modifications to be made in the MOA and Rules, as submitted by BIT. Some requirements in said letter of UGC were based on UGC Regulations of 2012 to which BIT had no access.

To be able to take further action on UGC letter dated January 1, 2013, clarifications, as necessary, were sought from UGC vide BIT letter dated February 11, 2013. Clarifications from UGC are still awaited.

48.10 INFORMATION ON STAFF MATTERS:

The details of resignations, superannuation, study leave, sabbatical leave, extra-ordinary leave of faculty members were presented and the Board noted the same.

48.11 RECRUITMENT OF FACULTY/STAFF:

The Board noted the shortlisting of the applications received against various faculty positions and the Selection Committees being constituted as per UGC rules and regulations.

48.12 PROMOTIONS AND TRANSFERS:

The Board noted the Promotions under Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) for the faculty members.

48.13 DEANS/ASSOCIATE DEANS:

The Board noted that with permission of the Chairman, the position of Dean (Faculty and Sponsored Research) has been split as Dean (Faculty Affairs) and Dean (Sponsored Research).

The Board also noted that a new position of the Dean (Alumni & International Relations) has been instituted and positions of the Dean (External Relations & Coordination) and the Dean (Administration & Campus Development) have been discontinued. Rest of the positions of the Deans viz. UG, PG & Research, Admissions & Academic Coordination, and Student Welfare remain same. All the positions of Deans/Associate Deans have been offered initially for a period of one year and are extendable for a maximum tenure of 3 years.

48.14 SALARY OF THE VICE-CHANCELLOR:

The Board approved that the basic pay of the Vice-Chancellor be same as the basic pay of Directors of IITs/IIMs i.e.basic pay of Rs. 80000/- (fixed) with admissible allowances and benefits w.e.f. 01.04.2014.

48.15 TEQIP - II MATTERS:

The Board noted and approved the proposed TEQIP – II matters with modifications incorporated as follows:

- i. As per the previous norms, revisions in the procurement plan were made with approval of Vice-Chancellor. As per communication of NPIU dated 10 Dec 2012, any number of changes in procurement plan of TEQIP-II can be made only with the approval of the Board.
- ii. The Board delegated its authority to the Vice-Chancellor to approve changes in the procurement plan of TEQIP-II up to 20%. For changes above 20%, approval of the Chairman shall be required.
- iii. Annual contributions into each of the four funds i.e. Corpus fund, Faculty development fund, Equipment replacement fund and Maintenance fund may be at least 0.5% (total 2%) of total annual recurring expenditure of the Institute. Such funds may be utilized for the respective activities after completion of TEQIP-II.

48.16 INTRODUCTION OF AWARDS:

The following awards were approved for conferment on Foundation Day (15th July) every year by the Chairman or his nominee with number of awards not exceeding at any time the provisions specified below:

The Board directed that the proposed B M Birla (BMB) Lecture on Education and G P Birla (GPB) Lecture on Technology be renamed as BIT Lecture on Education and BIT Lecture on Technology respectively. Modalities for selection of recipients of these awards and lectureships including the BIT Lecture on National Economy shall be approved by the Chairman.

The Board was informed that with permission of the Chairman, three Professors with long and distinguished services to B I T in many different capacities had been appointed as B.M. Birla Distinguished Service Professors. Board noted the same and directed to amend their appointments in line with the modifications in nomenclature suggested by the Board from B.M. Birla Distinguished Service Professor to G.P. Birla Distinguished Services Professor.

48.17 CAMPUS PLACEMENTS:

The Board noted that a total of 72 recruiters, covering all major sectors of the Industry, had visited BIT for participation in the Campus Recruitment Programme 2013-14 with total of 1085 offers made so far.

48.18 STUDENT ACTIVITIES:

The Board noted various technical and cultural activities organised by the students of the Mesra Campus and Off Campuses.

48.19 SERVICE BENEFITS DURING EXTRA ORDINARY LEAVE/LEAVE WITHOUT PAY/DEPUTATION TO OFF-SHORE CAMPUSES:

The Board approved the modified provision that the period(s) of Extra Ordinary Leave/Leave without Pay/Deputation to Off-Shore Campuses granted to an employee shall not constitute a break in service but will not be considered for retirement benefits like gratuity, leave encashment and provident fund contributions etc. was approved by the Board.

48.20 RENAMING OF TECHNICAL COUNCIL AS ACADEMIC COUNCIL:

The Board approved the recommendation of the Technical Council in its 90th meeting held on 13 December 2013 that the Technical Council will henceforth be known as the "Academic Council" to align its role with the Deemed University status of BIT Mesra.

- 1. The Board approved the following recommendations of the Technical Council in its Special Meeting held on 3rd May, 2014:
 - Creation of a new department: "Department of Humanities & Social Science" to i. cater to the need for humanities and social science subjects in the curriculum of various UG and PG programmes.
 - (a) Academic {except as clarified in sub-para (b)}, administrative and accounts ii. offices, to migrate to working 5 days in a week (Monday to Friday) with working schedule from 9.00 AM to 5.30 PM with a lunch break of 30 minutes.
 - (b) Classes are to be conducted with teaching slots from 8.00 AM to 5.10 PM and the respective HoDs / In-Charges of academic departments shall make necessary adjustment in the working schedule of faculty members to ensure smooth conduct of theory classes/labs/workshops in their respective departments. Individual faculty members shall prominently display their office hours for all the courses assigned to them and HoDs / In-Charges shall be responsible for ensuring such notified office hours by their faculty members.
 - (c) All other departments/sections with mandated / essential services shall continue to function with the same arrangement as in force earlier, without any change in number of working days or working hours in a week.

47.01 CONFIRMATION:

The Minutes of the Forty Sixth meeting of the Board of Governors of the Institute was confirmed.

47.02 ACTION- TAKEN REPORT ON DECISIONS OF THE LAST MEETING:

The follow-up actions taken on the decisions of the 46th meeting were presented before the Board as under –

- a. Action taken was reported with respect to renaming of UG & PG Programmes in Engineering from B. E. to B.Tech. and M. E. to M.Tech. The Board directed to get it implemented w.e.f. the next academic session 2014-15 after the required mandatory formalities are completed.
 - b. The Board was apprised of the observations of Technical Council (TC) regarding the required revision of course structures before merging of the departments. Vice-chancellor informed the board regarding some of the concerns on the merger of certain departments as was expressed in the TC meeting as well as by the faculty members of the relevant Departments. The Board directed to go ahead with merger of the departments as decided in the 46th BOG meeting with effect from the academic session 2014-15 except the merger of Remote Sensing with Civil Engg., which should be deferred until the academic session 2015-16 in view of the concerns appraised by the Vice-Chancellor regarding the science back ground of the faculty members.
 - c. The Board noted that the exit option in the programme of Hotel Management and Catering Technology has already become effective from 2011-12 academic session and full admissions in 2013 and constitution of a committee to study the effective utilization of the infrastructure of the department. Nevertheless, it was desired by the board to have a relook at continuing with this department.
 - d. The Board noted and agreed to the lateral entry provisions to B.Pharm at BIT, Mesra and to B.E. only in the off campuses of BIT to be made effective from 2014-15 academic session for which, admission committee of the Institute has already been instructed to finalise the admission eligibility criteria.
 - e. The Board noted and agreed to the matter of rationalization of tuition fee reported as well as observation of the TC on the fee structure for the students of Off-campuses and revised fees of some M.Sc. Courses including Integrated M.Sc.
- The Board noted the action taken on the matter of appointment of Deans.
- The Board noted the action taken on new and modified code of conduct in respect of the employees.
- The Board noted the action taken on facility for solar heating system as per its earlier directives.
- The Board noted the aborting of BIT Off-Shore Campus program in Srilanka due to the prevailing political situation in Sri Lanka.
- The Board noted the action taken on its earlier directives on Bachelor of Engineering in Biotechnology at BIT Patna Campus.
- 46.12 The Board noted the action taken on the Fund for DST-FIST Projects as per

its decision in the 46th BOG meeting.

- The Board noted the action taken on the submission of memorandum of association and rules of the Birla Institute of Technology to UGC.
- The Board noted the action taken on the policy for appointment on compassionate ground for the relatives of deceased employees of BIT.
- The Board noted the action taken on reversal of appointments of 2 faculty members from Professor to Associate Professor. Upon being informed by the Vice-Chancellor regarding their representations, the Board directed that the case of Dr. Sandip Dutta be referred back to the Committee which reviewed his case earlier *for further review* on the ground that Dr. Sandip Dutta had acquired the degree of Ph.D before the Interview, which was chaired by the then Vice-Chancellor and also had more than four years of teaching experience as Associate Professor even if the period of three years for obtaining PhD is excluded (as per the decision in the meeting of all the Chairmen of Departmental Short listing committees with Vice-Chancellor) from the total experience. The case of Dr. (Mrs.) Aruna Jain was directed to be considered through selection committee for the forthcoming faculty recruitments as per UGC norms.
- 46.S-8 The Board noted the action in process for establishment of Department of Biotechnology and Department of Remote Sensing at BIT Patna campus.
- The Board noted the action taken on monthly honorarium to the Controller of Examinations.
- 46.S-10 The Board noted the action taken on appointment of three retired Professors of BIT as Advisers.

47.03 ANNUAL REPORT 2011-2012

The Annual Report of the Institute for the period 2011-12 was perused and the Board expressed satisfaction over the activities of the Institute.

47.04 ANNUAL ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT REPORT FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2012-13

The Annual Accounts and the Auditors Report for 2012-13 were placed before the Board as recommended by the Finance Committee. This was perused and approved by the Board.

47.05 BUDGET ESTIMATES FOR 2013-14 AND FINANCE COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

The Board considered the recommendations of the Finance Committee and approved the Budget Estimates for the FY 2013-14.

47.06 VICE-CHANCELLOR OF THE INSTITUTE

As per Clause 20 of the Memorandum of Association and Rules of BIT, Mesra (Ranchi), Prof. Manoj Kumar Mishra has been appointed as the Vice-Chancellor of the Institute out of a panel of three names recommended by the special search committee.

47.07 CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS

As per rules of the Institute, Shri C. K. Birla was appointed by the General Council as Chairman of Board of Governors in April, 2010 for a period of 3 years. The Board noted that the General Council renewed his appointment for a further period of 3 years from April, 2013 to continue thereafter, until decided otherwise.

47.08 NOMINATION OF HCT ON THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS

The Board noted that Hindusthan Charity Trust (HCT) re-nominated Shri M. L. Pachisia and Shri Rohit Saboo as their nominees on the Board of Governors for a further period of 3 years.

47.09 XXIII CONVOCATION

The Board noted that the XXIII Convocation was held on 10th April, 2013 presided over by the Hon'ble Chancellor of the Institute, His Excellency the Governor of Jharkhand, Dr. Syed Ahmed and Shri Nandan Nilekani, Chairman, Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI), delivered the Convocation Address as Chief Guest. A total of 3393 students were awarded Degrees and Diplomas in various disciplines.

47.10 AWARD OF DEGREE/DIPLOMA

The Board considered and approved the Technical Council's recommendations for the award of Ph D Degree to the scholars as well as award of Degree/Diploma to the students found eligible as per respective Rules and Regulations of the Institute.

Resolved that these scholars/students be admitted to the Degree/Diploma in various disciplines in the ensuing convocation.

47.11 INVESTMENT AND BANK ACCOUNT

In suppression and cancellation of the existing arrangements regarding investments and bank accounts the following officials have been authorised by the Board to take decisions from time to time as considered appropriate for short/long term investment in banks as well as mutual and other funds and sign necessary papers as permissible under the law;

- a) Treasurer
- b) Vice Chancellor
- c) Assistant Treasurer

The above signatories are further authorised by the Board to jointly take decisions related to opening, closing and operation of bank accounts and the Registrar is hereby authorized to communicate with the banks regarding any opening, closing and changes in signatories of any existing bank accounts.

The proposed changes in operation of bank accounts were reported to the Board which were agreed upon. The details are as per Annexure - III.

47.12 UGC REGULATION 2010

The Board was informed about the action taken regarding revised Memorandum of Association and Rules as mentioned hereunder:

Based on UGC Regulations of 2010, as applicable to Deemed Universities, UGC vide its letter dated December 21, 2011 required BIT to submit its revised MOA and Rules incorporating specific provisions, as contained in the said letter of UGC. The Revised MOA and Rules of BIT were forwarded to UGC with BIT letter dated August 30, 2012.

In reply, vide letter dated January 1 2013, UGC required certain modifications to be made in the MOA and Rules, as submitted by BIT. Some requirements in said letter of UGC were based on UGC Regulations of 2012 to which BIT had no access.

To be able to take further action on UGC letter dated January 1, 2013, clarifications, as necessary, were sought from UGC vide BIT letter dated February 11, 2013. Clarifications from UGC are still awaited.

47.13 EARN LEAVE DURING THE PERIOD 1987 – 2008 (IN LIEU OF WORKING DURING SUMMER)

Decision had earlier been taken to grant ad-hoc leave to teaching staff for assumed working during summer vacations. Upon reconsideration of the issue, it was proposed that the credit of Earn leave in the ratio of 2:1 to be considered in lieu of balance of compensatory leave standing to the credit of each faculty for summer working as on 31st December 2008. It was further proposed that any payment already made to any teaching staff on the basis of earlier leave has to be adjusted from arrear payments due to them.

The Board approved the same.

47.14 INFORMATION ON STAFF MATTERS

Matters pertaining to resignations, superannuation, study leave, sabbatical leave, extra-ordinary leave, etc. in respect of Staff were reported to the Board as per the details in Annexure IV:

(A) RESIGNATIONS

The Board noted that 28 staff members (excluding research fellow/project staff) resigned during January 2013 to September 2013 due to various reasons and relieved from services as per Institute rules.

(B) SUPERANNUATIONS

The Board noted that 23 staff members retired from the Institute service on attaining the age of superannuation in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Institute.

(C) STUDY LEAVE /EXTRA ORDINARY LEAVE (EOL)

The Board noted that 19 staff members were granted Study Leave with pay and 15 staff members on Extra Ordinary Leave/Study Leave without pay during January 2013 to September 2013.

47.15 RECRUITMENT OF FACULTY/STAFF

The Board noted that with due approval of the competent authority, 30 faculty/staff members were appointed on Regular/Contract basis during January 2013 to September 2013 in accordance with Rules & Regulations of the Institute.

47.16 PROMOTIONS AND TRANSFERS

The Board noted that 41 faculty members at the Assistant Professor level were promoted under the Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) during January 2013 to September 2013. It was also noted that 9 faculty/staff members were transferred during the above period.

47.17 APPOINTMENTS OF HEAD OF THE DEPARTMENT (HoD)

It was proposed that the appointments of HoDs be made on rotation basis initially for a period of 1 year which may be extended for another year on satisfactory performance. However, the maximum period shall not be more than three years. It was also proposed to include Associate Professors (with atleast 3 years experience as Associate Professor in the Department) as HoDs in such cases where the term of the incumbent as HoD is already over and where there is only one Professor in the Department.

The Board accorded its approval to the same.

47.18 APPOINTMENTS OF ACTING VICE CHANCELLOR & ACTING REGISTRAR

The Board noted the appointment of Dr. P. K. Barhai, Dean (Faculty & Sponsored Research) as Acting Vice Chancellor by the Chairman, Board of Governors, with effect from 12th January 2013, after relieving of Dr. Ajay Chakrabarty, Vice Chancellor till such time a Vice-Chancellor is appointed.

The Board also noted the appointment of Dr. A. P. Krishna, Professor, Deptt. of Remote Sensing as Acting Registrar by the competent authority with effect from 30th April, 2013 till such time a Registrar is appointed.

47.19 MATERNITY LEAVE

As per the resolution of the 44th Board Meeting, it was decided that maternity leave be granted to permanent (confirmed) female employees of the Institute on full pay for a period not exceeding 180 days.

It was proposed that maternity leave, henceforth, be granted to all female employees of the Institute. This was being placed before the Board to consider and approve.

However, the Board directed to check and analyse the maternity leave figures of last 3 years for different categories of female employees and deferred any action till the next Board meeting.

47.20 REVISED FEE-STRUCTURE FOR STUDENTS OF BBA, BCA, M.Sc. AND Ph.D. PROGRAMMES

The Board noted the revision of fee-structure from the academic session 2013-14 for BBA, BCA, Integrated M.Sc./M.Sc. (Applied Sciences) courses and Ph.D. programmes at BIT, Mesra Based on the recommendation of the Fee-Restructuring Committee of the Institute.

47.21 INTRODUCTION OF RESEARCH PROMOTION GRANT (RPG)

The proposal for introduction of Research Promotion Grant RPG) out of the overhead grant of the Sponsored Projects was placed before the Board. The Board after some deliberations directed to introduce such schemes at the institute level itself with approval of the competent authority of the Institute.

47.22 INTRODUCTION OF NEW PROGRAMMES

Introduction of some new full-time UG & PG programmes in the academic session 2013-14 at BIT, Mesra and its other Extension Campuses was reported to the Board and it was noted.

47.23 CAMPUS PLACEMENTS

The Board noted that a total of 85 recruiters, covering all major sectors of the Industry, had visited BIT for participation in the Campus Recruitment Programme 2012-13 with total of 1195 offers made so far.

The Board noted various technical and cultural activities organised by the students of the Mesra Campus and the Off Campuses.

47.25 BITOSA GLOBAL CENTRE & GUEST HOUSE AT BIT PREMISES

The Board noted and agreed to the proposal of BIT Old Students' Association (BITOSA) to construct an Alumni House-cum-office for BITOSA inside the campus. The Board further made it clear that the physical infrastructure be at Ranchi whereas, functioning of BITOSA Global centre may be permitted from Bangalore chapter.

47.26 NPA TO INSTITUTE DOCTORS

It was proposed that henceforth (w.e.f. 01.11.2013), Non-Practicing Allowance (NPA) as per the existing norms of other similar educational Institutions be given to the full-time Doctors in Pay Band III of the Institute Dispensary.

The Board agreed and approved.

47.27 MONTHLY ALLOWANCE TO THE DIRECTORS OF OFF-CAMPUSES

It was proposed to have a provision of a monthly allowance of Rs. 5000/- henceforth (w.e.f. 01.11.13), to the Directors of the Off-Campuses of BIT Mesra.

The Board agreed and approved.

47.28 TRANSFER & POSTING OF THE EMPLOYEES

It was proposed that any employee of the Institute may be transferred to serve in any of the Off Campuses/Off-shore Campuses as and when required.

The Board agreed and approved.

47.29 PROVISION OF ADDITIONAL INCREMENTS UPON OBTAINING Ph.D.

Approval of the 'Technical Council' regarding the Provision of two non-compounded additional Increments as per existing norms upon obtaining Ph.D. degree in relevant discipline to be made applicable to all the faculty members of the Institute in Pay Band III was placed before the Board for approval.

The Board agreed and approved.

47.30 PERIOD OF SERVICE DURING EXTRA ORDINARY LEAVE/LIEN/LEAVE WITHOUT PAY/DEPUTATION TO OFF-SHORE CAMPUSES

It was proposed that Extra Ordinary Leave/Lien/Leave Without Pay/Deputation to Off-Shore Campuses granted to an employee shall be considered as authorised break in service. Such period shall henceforth (w.e.f. 01.11.2013), not be taken into consideration for calculation of benefits like earn leave, increment and gratuity etc.

The Board agreed and approved.

47.31 CENTRALISATION OF EXAMINATION

In the 45th BOG meeting held on 3rd July 2012, board had approved the decentralization of all UG and PG examinations from the Monsoon 2012 session.

Because of various operational difficulties due to involvement of different off-campuses and off-shore campuses, it was proposed in the 89th Technical Council (TC) to revert to centralized examination system w.e.f. Monsoon 2013 session.

The Board agreed and approved.

47.32 REMUNERATION FOR EXAMINATION WORK

In view of implementation of centralized examination system, it was proposed to reintroduce remuneration for examination work to the faculty members w.e.f Monsoon 2013 session.

The Board agreed and approved.

47.33 ITI DIGHAGHAT

Considering the operational difficulties in fulfilling the obligations as per MoU with the Government of Bihar related to ITI Dighaghat, it is proposed that BIT should explore the possibility of termination of the MoU, including refund of any balance amount due to the Government of Bihar.

The Board agreed and approved.

47.34 FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR FOREIGN TRAVEL UNDER TEQIP - II

The provision for financial assistance from TEQIP-II for attending International Conferences and Symposia during the tenure of the Project was considered and approved by the Board.

47.35 SCHOLARSHIPS UNDER TEQIP-II

As per the provision of award of PG and Ph.D Scholarships under TEQIP-II during the tenure of the project, approval of the Board was sought for the award of Scholarships to PG and PhD Scholars at the following rate:

• Non GATE ME/MTech students - Rs. 5000/- per month

• PhD scholars - Rs 18000/- per month for Engineering and Rs 16000/- per month for Science

Campus Recruitment Programme 2013-14


Overview

The Recruitment programme has generated a total of 1085 offers and several meritorious students have also received multiple offers. 10 recruiters visited BIT campus for the first time this year and the process yield satisfactory results. Average salaries have shown an upward trend for undergraduate engineering students.

Sector-wise Scenario

In terms of representation from the Sectors, the industrial slowdown impacted both the number of recruiters as well as the number of selects per recruiter mostly in the Infrastructure, Power and Automobile sector. The Pharmaceutical sector was another sector that was impacted due to a lot of internal re-organisation with regulatory mechanisms coming of age and because of the impact of the DPCO. The slowdown has also reflected, over the past two years, on the recruitment of the Post-Graduate students and this is reflected across all major institutions as much as BIT. The recruiters, with their limited targets, were largely inclined towards selecting BE students who also performed up to the desired level of expectations and even received multiple offers.





Compensation

The average salary for the BE students this year was 6.9 lakhs per annum which is more than the average 6.04 lakhs of the year 2012-13. The highest compensation was INR 20.5 lakhs and in terms of the international offers, the highest salary achieved by a BIT student US\$ 1.09 lakhs.



Training & Assessment

As in earlier years, a PAN-BIT assessment process was conducted by the Training & Placement Division in which all the Pre-final year students participated. Individual scores were given to the students and the results, branch-wise were shared with all Departmental Heads and the Directors of all the Extension Centres of BIT.

Rigorous training sessions were conducted in Soft Skills throughout the 6^{th} Semester for both UG and PG students.

Ranking

The first rankings of the year are out from the publication, DATAQUEST which is the most respected publication of the Technology Sectorr and provides overall and parameter-wise rankings to all major Institutes in India. In the parameter pertaining to Placement, BIT Placements have ranked 7th and in terms of HR perception, BIT has ranked 9th, thereby coming in the Top 10 for the first time in two parameters. The overall ranking of the Institute remains at 13.
