Board noted that as per the MOU signed during May 2017 providing continuity to our earlier MOU with Government of Jharkhand, which had expired in the year 2011, an amount of Rs. 107 Crores (approx.) had become payable to us factoring it from the year 2013-14 up to the current fiscal year 2017-18. This excluded the dues for the years 2011-12 and 2012-13 yet to be provisioned by Govt. of Jharkhand (GoJ) for payment. An amount of Rs. 8 Crores was released as first Instalment initially as reported in the last meeting. Institute received an additional instalment of Rs. 18 Crores in the month of March 2018 with Rs. 26 Crores thus being the total received from GoJ during FY 2017-18.

57.08 ARREARS OF 7TH CENTRAL PAY COMMISSION (CPC)

Board noted that upon implementation of 7th CPC provisions, arrears for the period January 2016 to December 2016 were paid to all the staff.

Board noted that as stipulated by UGC Regulation 2016, revisions to our Memorandum of Association and Rules were required and are being readied for submission to UGC. Board also noted that in compliance of these regulations, our partners at Ras Al Khaima and Muscat Off shore campuses were informed about our inability to continue with the present arrangements.

57.14 NATIONAL INSTITUTIONAL RANKING FRAMEWORK (NIRF) RANKING

Board noted that among Engineering Institutions, we improved upon our NIRF ranking of 2017 by 5 places finishing 26th in 2018. The 26th rank was based on an evaluation of 1106 engineering institutions including 25 IITs, 29 NITs and 23 IIITs all of which have been notified as Institute of National Importance (INI). A comparative analysis was placed before the Board.



Campus Placements

CAMPUS RECRUITMENT PROGRAMME 2017-18

Interim Report till 15-04-2018

Overview

Total number of recruiters who have visited Mesra Campus till 15/04/2018 is 144, which has generated 748 numbers of Full Time Employment offers out of 1480 eligible candidates inclusive of all campuses and 336 numbers of Internship offers across different sectors of the industry. Major recruiters ranging from Investment Banks to Analytics & Consulting, Automobile to Heavy Engineering and Infrastructure, IT Product to IT Services visited the campus for placement. 49 recruiters have visited BIT campus for the first time this year and the recruiters who visited last year for the first time have continued this year and the process yielded satisfactory results. Several meritorious students have received multiple offers.

The BE students of Mesra Campus with a total batch strength of 709 and a total of 532 eligible students, received a total of 451 offers. Considering the percentage placement of eligible students, 94% students from BE Computer Science, 77% from BE Electronics & Communication & 93% from BE Information Technology, 76% of the BE Mechanical Engineering, 77% of BE Production Engineering and 78% of BE Electrical Engineering students got offers from different sectors. Likewise, 75%, 63%, 49% and 45% of students from Chemical, Chemical & Polymer, Civil and Bio-Engineering respectively have got placed.

Highlights of Recruitment (2017-18) Mesra Campus







B) PG(Engineering) Placements (Mesra Campus)






